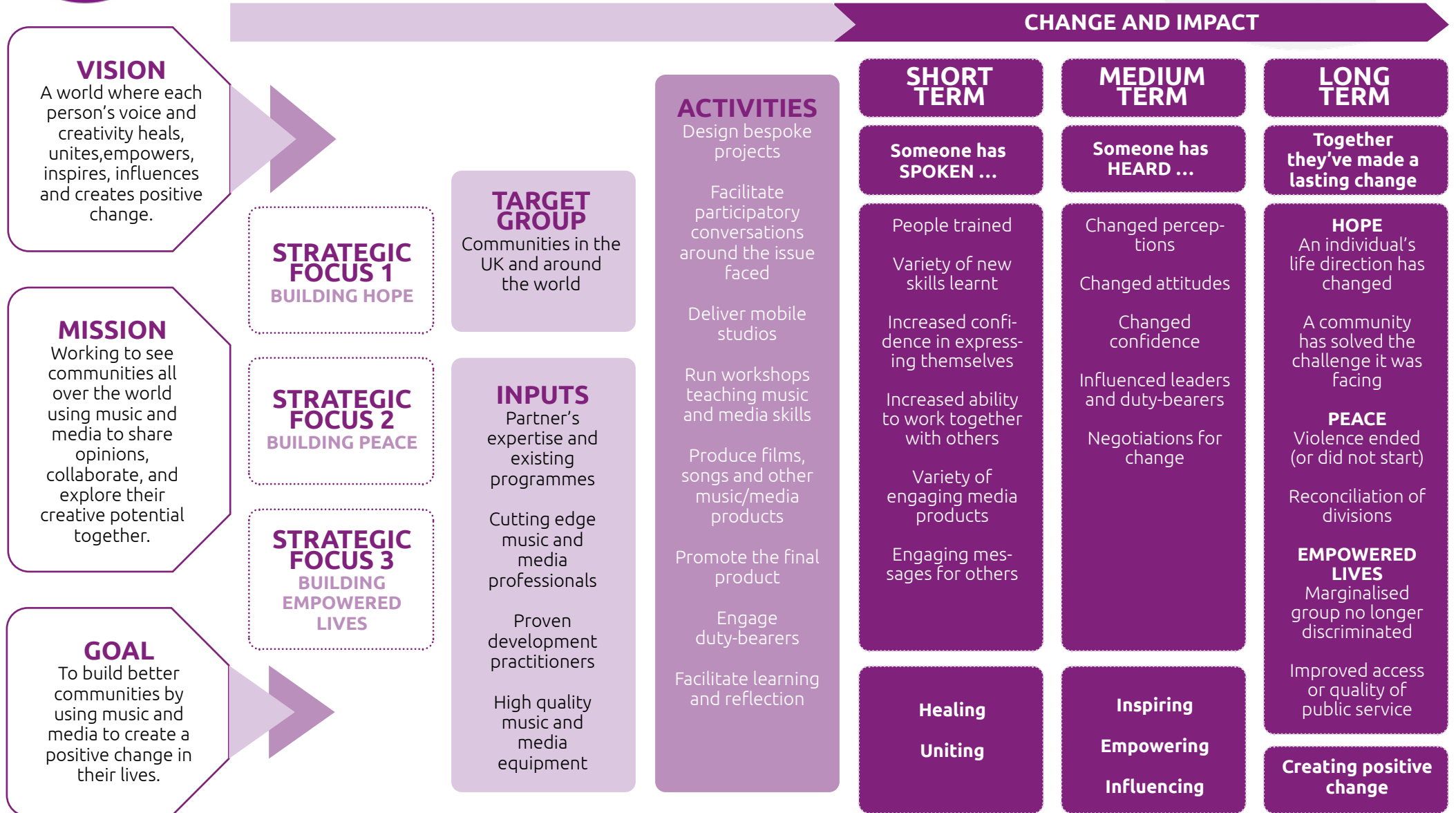

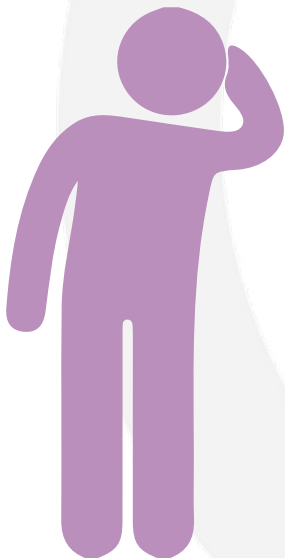

EMPOWER



Upbeat London

Upbeat London is Upbeat Banbury's sister project and has been running for almost 2 years now. Just like Upbeat Banbury, it's specifically aimed at young people who are finding school/college challenging, and also those who have special educational needs.

Each session differs for each young person and largely depends on what they'd like to do and what they're able to achieve. Often, the young people simply want to be recorded singing along to their favourite songs. They can take their recordings home and show friends and family. A number of young people have proudly had their music played to fellow classmates at school giving them a sense of pride in their achievements. Other young people enjoy learning songwriting, production and DJing skills, and develop transferable skills such as self discipline. Many gain an invaluable confidence that extends to their everyday life.

Shari is one of the fabulous young people we see each week. When she first came to us she was quite unresponsive despite her mother's efforts, had issues with wearing headphones and was very reticent to sing. We worked with her initially using percussion instruments and as she became used to these, she slowly started to sing. Now she happily comes to the sessions with a big smile, is always ready to sing and dance and has no issues putting on her headphones. This, of course, puts a big smile on our faces too! Her confidence in every day life has markedly increased

as a result of the sessions. Below is a short film where Shari's mum explains her journey and the impact the sessions have had on her life:

N is another of the young people we enjoy seeing each week. He has been referred by the local SEMH school.

Lucy, who leads the sessions says:

"N has been new to the sessions this year. He's comfortably taken to writing his own music with a great chorus line. I was told by his TA it's rare to see him produce a paragraph in English class but in the studio he's writing 2-3 verses! He's such a great student with a great sense of humour."

EMPOWER

Banbury Studio and Upbeat Banbury

Motivated by the positive feedback we've received about our London studio design, we decided to give our Banbury studio a make over.

We opened this studio almost 5 years ago at The Hill Community Centre in Bretch Hill, Oxfordshire. We wanted to positively impact mental health and improve mental well-being in local children and young people, so using the music studio as a base, we began teaching music technology and instrument playing such as drums, guitar and keyboards. As well as learning instruments and technical skills such as production and editing, the young people also began to learn transferable skills such as teamwork and self-discipline which extended beyond the studio and into their daily lives. This is still the case today, and more recently with funding from Children in Need, we've been able to expand and have the honour of witnessing the transformative impact of music in the lives of numerous young people.

Serena, who leads these sessions, says the revamp has been a positive step:



"It's great to be able to invest in something that is so positively impacting the local community and we're super pleased the young people like the upgrade!"

New Projects Creating Local Jobs

It's great when we meet local people on our projects who show potential and want to make a difference in their community.

We first met Dawn during lockdown when she joined us on one of our online projects and we quickly realised what a great musician she was. Fast forward a few years and we discovered she's also got an amazing eye for editing films so we asked if she'd help us with a filming project we were working on with Greenwich University and their study into the issue of migrants with no recourse to public funds. Dawn readily agreed, and the film was shown at an event hosted by Bonny Downs Community Association, and attended by local MP, Sir Stephen

Timms, numerous councillors and organisations as well as the amazing families from the study. We were all so happy with Dawn's work that she's been well and truly welcomed into our CA family.



EMPOWER

Sunrise Multicultural Project

Sunrise Multicultural Centre supports ethnic minority families in Banbury who are mainly of Pakistani descent. Their aim is to increase cultural awareness and integration within the community through workshops and projects.



This year, we were delighted to collaborate with them and their Girls Group where we've been delving into different aspects of music and media. Funded by the Well Together Fund, each week we have the DJ controller set up and Jason has been teaching the girls how to mix different tracks. We've also been producing a wide array of musical genres on Logic X on the computer. The girls really enjoy vocal recording so we've recorded and edited several

podcasts which have gone down a storm! From celebrity gossip to arranged marriages, all topics have been covered. The sessions are full of laughs and the girls have been really hands on in their approach which is wonderful.

Anila, youth worker, said:

"Thank you for the sessions. The girls absolutely love them!"

Ayesha, one of the participants continues:

"This was a new experience for me and I had the best time, I can't wait to do it again. When can we do it again?"



Grimsbury Youth Club

Grimsbury Community Centre in Oxfordshire is a great place which brings the local community together. We started working with their youth group in the latter part of this year with generous funding from the Well Together Fund.



The children, all aged between 6 and 11, have been learning how to mix music on the DJ decks and how to produce music on the computers. The young people have shown a real passion for writing and recording raps, and we've produced and recorded 2 songs over

this period. There was much excitement as Christmas approached as they wrote their own Christmas song.

Marc, who co-leads the sessions says:

"The sessions at the youth club are great fun, really productive sessions filled with big energy and lots of laughter."

We look forward to seeing these young people grow in their love for creating music and performing.



EMPOWER

Nai's House

Nai's House are an inspiring organisation that provide suicide prevention and holistic mental health support to young people under the age of 30. We feel honoured to have been partnering with them for 3 years now and we're very pleased this could continue with funding from the UK Prosperity Fund and The Unlock Futures Fund from Bicester Village which both support local charities in creating projects that make a difference in the community.

We run both 1:1 'Upbeat' and group 'Music United' sessions here, teaching around 20 young people how to play instruments. They start off learning individually and then, if they feel able to, they come together to form a group. This year, the young people have been learning about song writing and recording.

Kane, who leads the sessions, explains:

"We started with a theme and all young people contributed words, phrases and lyrics. The idea was that you can often say things in a song that might be difficult to talk about. We ended up with some very touching and personal words which were compiled into a song. The young people learned to play and sing the song and we all enjoyed recording it."

UNITE

Sing Out

Studies have shown that singing in a choir gives us an emotional lift. Endorphins are released which in turn reduces stress and anxiety levels, and contributes to us feeling energised and uplifted. We're always happy to start a new choir, so when The Hill Community Centre asked us to start a 'Singing for Wellness' group for older members of the community, we were super excited to begin!

With funding from Sanctuary Housing and Travis Perkins 'Social Value Team', 'Sing Out' started earlier this year and is already following in its sister group, 'Vocal Band's' footsteps in making a positive difference to all those that join in. One of the participants says:

"I went along to the second 'Sing Out for Wellness' session this afternoon and it was absolutely brilliant! I went along for the hour of singing but you're welcome to go earlier for a light lunch before the

session. The lovely lady leading said she didn't care what anyone's singing ability was, just to sing really loud! There was no pressure or judgement, everyone just did their own thing. This is something a little out of my comfort zone but I am so pleased I went along. It was a warm and friendly group and I certainly came away feeling uplifted"

It's been great to see this new choir making such a positive difference in the local community.



Vocal Band

Vocal Band is our weekly intergenerational choir for residents of Bretch Hill, Banbury. We've been running the choir for 9 years now at The Hill Community Centre. It's a wonderful opportunity for the local community to meet up and sing songs that bring hope and have positive messages. Lacey, who leads the choir says:

"I've been part of the choir for a long time and to now be running the session is incredible. Each and every member brings so much and they shine every time."

As well as weekly rehearsals, the choir also get together to record songs in our recording studio. In addition to appreciating Vocal Band's vocalists, it's been lovely seeing some of the young people becoming music recording engineers for the sessions. They've been learning from our CA

producers and gradually taking more responsibility as their knowledge and skills increase. Lorraine, Community Development Manager, says the impact of joining Vocal Band has been enormous for some:

"There have been people that Vocal Band has made a real difference to in their life. They've come and they've had really low self esteem and really been in quite low mental health. Being part of Vocal Band and encouraging them and finding themselves again and feeling confident has really gone on to help them pursue their dreams."

We've been very fortunate to receive funding from Sanctuary Housing and Travis Perkins 'Social Value Team' this year which has enabled Vocal Band to continue. We hope they carry on singing and making a positive difference in their community for many years to come!



UNITE



Rusties

Rusties is our programme for musicians over the age of 50 who may be experiencing anxiety, loneliness and/or isolation. With funding from The Mill Arts Centre and Cherwell District Council, musicians get together at The Mill Arts Centre in Banbury, Oxfordshire, to jam together and have some fun. Some bring their own instruments, others borrow ours but all are united in their love of music. For some of the participants it's

the only socialising they do all week so the sessions are really important and they've become a little family of their own. Some of the group have even set up their own band and play gigs in the community. The project has been so transformative for the group, that we will be offering similar sessions at The Hill in Banbury early next year. We're so excited to meet new musicians and see the amazing power of music work in their lives too.



Festivals and Community Events

It's always a highlight of our year to see our participants' hard work pay off when they perform at a festival or community event. Quite often, the people we work with have never performed before, and playing or singing in front of an audience is a massive achievement for them. For some, the journey to reach this stage is hugely transformative and a testament to the incredible power of music in their lives. We're always hugely proud of each and every person. We might even shed a happy tear or two watching them!

#BeNice Festival

It was so good to see the amazing Nai's House Band returning to the #BeNice Festival in Bicester this summer and performing a range of songs. They did brilliantly and we're so proud of this amazing bunch of young people and all they continue to achieve.

We also enjoyed showing aspiring young DJs how to use the decks, and it was great to see the excitement and enjoyment that playing on the drums brought too!

SCYPS Family Fun Day

It was really lovely to be invited to the Specialist Children and Young People's Services fun day in Stratford, East London this August and give people a taste of what we do in our one-to-one sessions. Young people were able to have a go on the drums and were shown some of the things they could do on the DJ decks. It was great to have Harrison, one of the young people from our Beats Working cohort, leading the way on the decks and showing the young people how much fun making music is!

"It was wonderful to spend some time with our partners at SCYPS and to see so many people enjoying making music together."

Christmas Concerts

Chalgrove

We were delighted to see and hear some of the young people from Nai's House take part in an annual Christmas community concert in Chalgrove, Oxfordshire this year. The venue was packed and the Nai's House Band did brilliantly performing a set of songs including their own song 'Wishing Tree'.

Simon, CA Co-Founder explains how valuable performing at events like this one can be:

"Performing in this way can have a profound impact on self-esteem, helping the young people become more confident and assured in expressing themselves. By sharing a deeply personal and meaningful song like Wishing Tree, the participants were able to communicate complex and difficult emotions in a powerful and creative way. For friends, family, and the wider community



who attended, witnessing a performance that addresses such sensitive topics can spark meaningful conversations, fostering greater understanding, empathy, and support within families and friendship groups."

Banbury

INSPIRE

Oxfordshire Hospital School

We've been working with the amazing children at the Oxfordshire Hospital School for 8 years now. We love being able to join the children on the wards and offer them the chance to connect with music. Depending on what the young people would like to do, this could be making digital music on laptops, playing instruments or singing with Kane, who brings his guitar and enjoys a good jamming session with the young people. Kane says:

"We've had some excellent participatory sessions where children, parents, nurses and teachers have all joined in singing on the ward and provided some momentary relief from everything going on for these families."

Over the course of the year we've worked with over 100 young people. The sessions often help them to express complex emotions such as fear, frustration, and anger and we feel very privileged to experience the healing power of music with them.



Chipping Norton School

For one of our team members, he is literally going back to school when teaching at Chipping Norton School's music club as he used to be a pupil there! Marc teaches all aspects of digital music, from music production to recording vocals, live instruments and everything in between. With CNS school having a recording studio, Marc has been able to record not just vocals and instruments but interviews and podcasts too. The pupils are great to work with, very eager to learn and hands on in all forms of production and recording.

One of the pupils, Sennen, says:

"I love the fact we have lots of freedom to make the type of music that we like!"

Marc continues: *"I absolutely love the CNS sessions, the pupils are so engaged and always wanting to get*

stuck in to recording vocals, whether it be singing, rapping or recording podcasts & interviews. They are a great set of pupils to work with and the sessions always leave a smile on my face."

As with many of our team members, we love that Marc has found his passion for music, made a professional career out of it and, working alongside his professional career, returned to his community to pass on that passion and expertise to others.

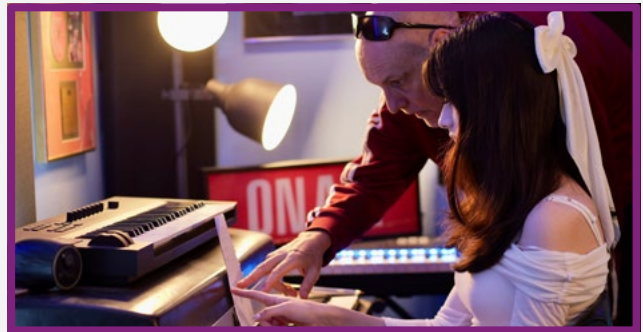
Beats Working

It's always good to see young people excited about music and wanting to further their hobby into a career. One of our aims moving forward is to identify talented young people from our existing projects and from our local partners, and take them to the next level in terms of professional engagement and employability prospects. We've therefore been super excited to start our 'Beats Working' project this year which is doing exactly this!

'Beats Working' is supported by Amplify London and primarily for young people in Newham aged 14-21. Led and mentored by our very own music industry professionals, the cohort have been working together to write and record a song in our London studio. The talented young people have been learning composition and production techniques, and taken through the process of writing and recording their song. The course runs until Easter '25 so plenty of time to carry on perfecting their song, learning about the mixing stages and mastering the final track. In addition to writing and recording, they will learn and actively experience not only the creative process and technical skills needed to make a record but they'll also learn about the discipline needed to succeed in the music industry. They will have a day's session at legendary AIR studios in North London with world famous session drummer, Andy Gangadeen, who currently plays with Chase and Status. Andy will play drums on the song as well as offering insight into working as a session musician. Sound engineer Kevan Gallagher who has worked alongside Ronan Keating and Annie Lennox amongst many others will also be at

the studio. Kevan will show the group the mechanics of recording, mixing and editing the song. A trip to LMA university where they can see what music degree courses are on offer should the young people wish to study further, is also in the diary for January '25.

When finished, the song will be shared online to a wider audience. It's a very catchy song that we can't stop humming so keep an eye on our social media for its release. We can't wait!

AQAs

Many of the young people we work with are either excluded from school, school refusers or on a reduced timetable so gaining recognised qualifications isn't always easy for them.

Being an approved centre for AQA's Unit Award Scheme in both Oxfordshire and London has been a really useful way to allow young people to engage with learning and have their achievements formally recognised. Each time a new unit of learning is successfully completed, students are rewarded with a certificate. Many of our young people have successfully

completed several units enabling them to build up a portfolio of certificates to evidence their skills, knowledge and experience.

Jan, Operations Manager, explains further:

"These educational achievements are great for boosting confidence, increasing engagement and improving motivation, and it's always an absolute highlight to see how proud the students are to receive their certificates and get recognition for the work they've achieved in their sessions."

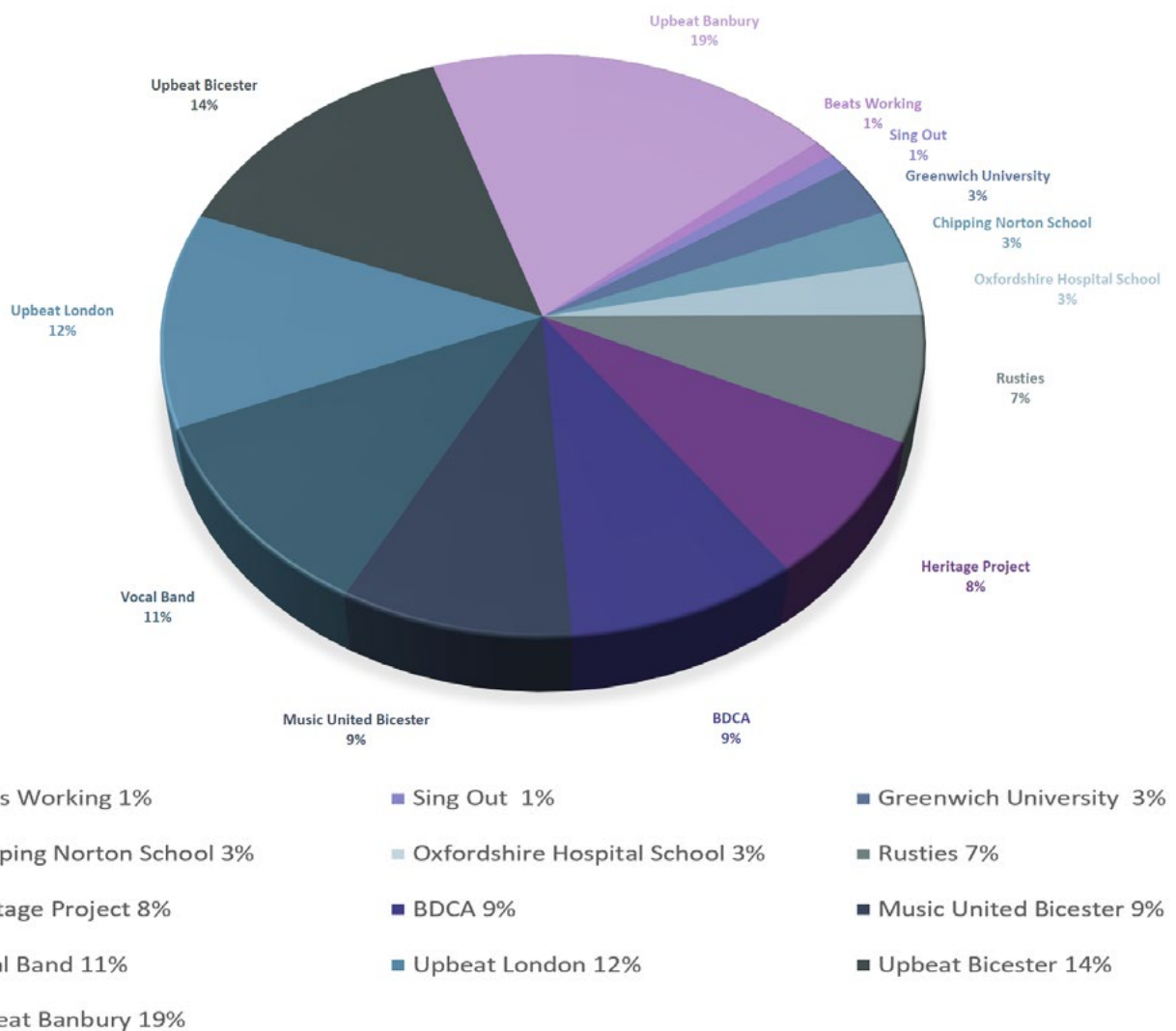

PROJECT EXPENDITURE



We currently have 1 member of staff and 2 volunteers who work towards core operational activities, and a group of 14 incredibly gifted musicians, filmmakers and producers who help us deliver activities with participants. Paid hours of work equate to approximately 48% of the time required to deliver projects successfully. 52% of the total time required to deliver projects is completed on a voluntary basis.

We are grateful to those who give up their time to support our ambition and achievements as a charity, and are working hard to ensure that funds are raised for more staff to support project delivery.
